They are required to input key data so that the paperwork for regulatory compliance, billing purposes, or security could be done by the company.

- 7. **Customer Service**: Prime mover drivers may interact with customers, shipping agents, and other stakeholders during the course of their duties. Providing courteous and professional service, addressing customer inquiries or concerns, and representing the company in a positive manner are important aspects of the job.
